## Man Of The Year 2011

The tradition of selecting a Man of the Year began in 1927, when editors of the American news magazine Time, contemplating newsworthy stories, decided to nominate the aviator Charles Lindbergh as the most representative person of the year for his historical trans-Atlantic flight.

So, if this year Time has decided to select as “man of the Year” the anonymous face of a protester, and the Catholic Magazine “Famiglia Cristiana” has chosen the face of the Italian President Giorgio Napolitano, CulturaCattolica.it has decided to settle upon the face of a saint: the Christian martyr Clement Shahbaz Bhatti.

At school we read and studied the poem by Ugo Foscolo “Dei Sepolcri”, where the poet exalts the importance of the gestures of past heroes to inspire the modern world, and we became certain that human greatness is the most powerful means to educate mankind. Hence [CulturaCattolica.it](http://CulturaCattolica.it), in respect of the several models of humanity which the year 2011 has showed, wishes to point out to everybody the figure and the example of Shahbaz Bhatti, the martyred Pakistani Minorities Minister assassinated on the 2nd of March 2011, owing to his staunch defence of religious freedom (reminding us of what he did to support Asia Bibi) in the face of extreme intimidation

The Jewish Rabbis said: “whoever saves one life saves the world entire”. Shahbaz Batthi with his sacrifice shows us the truth of this saying.
