

# The great mystery of the Immaculate Conception flag flying over Europe

Arsène Heitz had personally said that to create the sketch of the future European flag he was voluntarily inspired by the iconography of the miraculous medal donated by the Virgin on November 27, 1830 in which there are 12 stars that refer to the well-known passage of the Apocalypse in which it speaks of the woman crowned with 12 stars.

In 1917 the Blessed Virgin had come to **Fatima** to save humanity from the abyss of World War II and eternal damnation. But the failure to consecrate Russia was decisive for unleashing the horror on earth that led to about 70 million deaths and the Shoah.

Today we are experiencing the victory of the Immaculate Conception that took place thanks to the consecration which took place on March 25, 1984 by the will of St. John Paul II: this consecration had been accepted by the Lord, as the Ven. Sister Lucy last seer of Fatima said publicly and you can read on the official internet site of the Holy See Press Office:

The Berlin Wall was pulled down by the Faith of the new Moses. And as a living sign of the victory of the Immaculate Conception that she herself foretold in Fatima, today the flag of the Immaculate Conception flies over Europe before the eyes of all the men and women of our generation. But even this flag can unfortunately still be a sign of contradiction, as Jesus himself was for his generation. To understand the great mystery of love that is in the flag flying over Europe we must start from the theologically indisputable fact that, according to the two thousand year teaching of the Church, the Virgin can obtain everything from the Heart of her Son. And among the many apparitions of the Mother of God, that of November 27, 1830 with the ineffable gift of the miraculous medal is truly one of the greatest apparitions in 2000 years of history. And in this same text also some surprising and striking graces that leave you breathless.

The first of these graces is that of the conversion of the Jewish atheist Alphonse Ratisbonne. Today the flag of the Immaculate Conception flies over Europe and it is because She asked it her Son who has all power in heaven and on earth (Matthew 28:18) and the proofs that I now present to you leave no room for no doubt. In 1950 the first European Council in Strasbourg launched a competition for **the design of a common flag**. On March 25, 1957, the Treaties of Rome were signed, which constitute the historic birth certificate of the European Community, which was then transformed into today's European Union. That March 25, as every year, was the Solemnity of the Annunciation. On December 8, 1955, the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe adopted the current flag of the European Union. That 8 December, like every year, was the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. In September 2019, the official publishing house of the Council of Europe

From page 19 you can read the entire chapter entitled: “ **Paul Lévy and Arsène Heitz, the fathers of the European flag**”. And we find ourselves a mine of information that leave no room for doubt. Jewish by birth and converted to Catholicism in 1940, Paul Lévy was born on November 27, 1910: he was interned in the Fort Breendonk concentration camp but in July 1942 he managed to go to London. In 1949 he became the first director of the Communications and Information Office of the Council of Europe. Arsène Heitz was born on September 24, 1908: joining the French army during the Second World War, he took part in the liberation of Alsace.

In this chapter you will also be able to read their places of birth and the testimony of a cousin of Arsène Heitz in which it is clearly written that Arsène Heitz had personally said that to create the sketch of the future European flag he was voluntarily inspired by the iconography of the miraculous medal donated by the Virgin on November 27, 1830 in which there are **12 stars that refer to the well-known passage from the Apocalypse in which there is the woman crowned with 12 stars**. The text of this chapter of the book “Europe: a human enterprise” is limited in synthesis to this which, moreover, by itself is amazing and moving at the same time. But from here on we need to deepen the analysis of the unequivocal data provided by this book. I wanted to go further and what I found is absolutely shocking. The first thing to say right away is that Paul Lévy and Arsène Heitz were both Alsatians: Lévy was born in Rixheim which is about 50 miles from Huttenheim, Arsène Heitz's hometown. Continuing on it takes only another 18 miles of road to get to Strasbourg which is not only the seat of the European Parliament and the heart of Alsace. Strasbourg is exactly the place where Alphonse Ratisbonne was born, that young Jewish atheist who had the great grace of an apparition that changed his life forever on January 20, 1842, like St. Paul on the road to Damascus: in the Basilica of Sant'Andrea delle Fratte, in the center of Rome, Alphonse Ratisbonne saw the Virgin Mary and for this reason he immediately wanted to become Catholic. That January 20 Alphonse Ratisbonne was exactly 27 years old and wore around his neck - but until then to make fun of it - the miraculous medal of the apparition of November 27, 1830. The date of birth of Paul Lévy - in a truly impressive way - is exactly 27 November 1910 which coincides precisely with the 80th anniversary of this Marian apparition in Rue du Bac in the center of Paris. The date of birth of Arsène Heitz apparently does not seem so significant: Heitz was born on September 24, 1908, a date that even to the devotees of the miraculous medal could not say anything. But I wanted to investigate thoroughly and I discovered that, after his conversion to Catholicism, Alphonse Ratisbonne was ordained a priest exactly on September 23, 1848. The day Arsène Heitz was born was exactly the 60th anniversary of the first mass celebrated by Father Alphonse as Catholic priest. Furthermore, as reported in the book of the well-known mariologist Father René Laurentin: “*Caterina Labouré – La medaglia miracolosa*” edizioni Mimesis, the Virgin appeared with a blue mantle on November 27, 1830 and **that same deep blue is today the color of the European flag**. This book is based on the written testimonies of the Official Archive of the Daughters of Charity at Rue du Bac in Paris. But let's go back to that January 20, 1842: Alphonse Ratisbonne was exactly 27 years old and 27 is a very special number for those who know the history of the miraculous medal well. Saint Vincent de Paul himself, founder of the Congregation in which Saint Catherine Labouré was nun, had died on 27 September 1660. But the clues of the supernatural do not end there, because to everything I have described so far we add what anyone can notice visiting

the Parisian Chapel where the Virgin appeared. On the right side of the chapel rests the body of Saint Catherine Labouré, on the left side of the chapel rests the body of Saint Luisa de Marillac, founder of the female branch of the Congregation and her dates of birth and death have an enigmatic figure: Saint Louise was born in 1591 on 12 August and died in 1660 on day 15 March. If we add up the day of his birth and that of his death, we still get 27. In front of what is reported in the article at the first link I have provided and in front of all the coincidences that I have discovered and presented in this article, I cannot fail to conclude that everything this means only one thing: it is truly the Mother who calls her children, it is truly the Son of God who wants to embrace those whom from the Cross he called brothers. But for those who still cannot cross the threshold of hope, the Virgin, exactly as in Cana of Galilee, he wanted to ask for an overabundant and intoxicating grace: in fact, as anyone can verify, Alfonso Ratisbonne was born in 1814 exactly on May 1st. The following day 2 May was the day of Saint Catherine Labouré's birth in 1806. And both lived exactly 70 years. How can we forget that May is historically the most important month dedicated to filial devotion to the Virgin Mary. In fact, the first apparition of Fatima took place on May 13, 1917. But the Immaculate Heart of Mary 36 years after her still wanted to manifest itself with tears in her eyes for the sins and pains of her children. In fact, from 29 August to 1 September 1953 an image of the Immaculate Heart of Mary wept from the eyes in front of thousands of witnesses:

But in Saverio Gaeta's book and in the TV2000 video there is no further discovery of mine: the Virgin had appeared in Fatima in 1917 that is to say 36 years before these soprannatural facts happened in 1953. But exactly 36 years after 1953, in 1989 happened the miracle of the division of the Berlin Wall and, as has been objectively said by many, the human instrument of this miracle was precisely St. John Paul II, the pope of the consecration of March 25, 1984:

Just as the faith of Moses had obtained the division of the Red Sea and the liberation of the God's chosen people in a great Exodus from the slavery of Egypt, so the faith of John Paul II had obtained the division of the Berlin Wall and the liberation of the East from the Communist dictatorship.

As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. " (Jn 13:34). The total revolution of the civilization of love is still possible, it is one step away from us.
